The ramblings of Your MVVC President - Dan Pierce

As most VW enthusiasts in Michigan know, for 2022 Michigan Vintage VW Club moved the VW Festival from Ann Arbor to Frankenmuth during the Bavarian Festival.

A recap and some thoughts on the new venue.

Overall I would like to say the weekend was a Success in most ways. There are things that need to be improved upon, but for the most part we reached many goals this year.

The Good...

We finally have a full weekend event. Friday night main st show, Saturday Riverplace main show, and Sunday Parade.

We finally have a show where the spectating public far outnumbers the people bringing the cars to the show. I was happy we got away from a (dance recital) car show where the lions share of the spectators are the people who brought the cars as well as their family. The show was very well attended by the public who were actually there for Bavarian festival.

We are now as a club financially stable for another year or two, in no small part due to the new venue.

We have retained most of our traditional sponsors and added a very big new one.

All of the sponsors I talked to were very happy with the results of the show.

On top of record profit despite not charging the spectators,

We lessened our expenses by probably 80% from past shows due to a free location (was over 2500.00 to rent the Riverside Park) and we had no trash expenses or music expenses as VWOA brought their own music.

We had less setup and take down responsibilities which makes it easier to set up and take down the show. Reduced the amount of manpower needed to run the event.

What we need to improve upon for 2023....

We need to work out a better deal with the city counsel for next year to have 50 parking spaces for Fri-

day nights event. (Zehnders has already approved 50 free chicken dinners). For 2022 we only had 30 spaces (which I figured would be enough). Also they closed down the road much earlier than was discussed. This caused many club members who drove maybe an hour or more to the Friday night event to be locked out of the event with their cars which is unacceptable and I personally apologize to those who could not enjoy the event with their cars. I will personally take responsibility for this short coming and will work hard to get 50 spaces for 2023. If it was not for Al Zehnder we would not have been able to be on the road at all. We had to fight hard for the 30 spaces. After the positive feedback from show goers and sponsors I hope to make a good case for 50 spaces for 2023.

We need better internet access to take credit cards or utilize a 5g network wifi to take credit card sales (already have a fix for this through T mobile).

For Saturdays event we need to move the Swap meet to the parking lot directly behind the show (where we put overflow cars this year) and move all show cars onto the grass and where we previously put the swappers (North parking lot).

We should consider changing the show time for Saturday to 10am to 5pm as many stayed that late and that seemed to be the busy time with show goers.

Try to have the concessions open at 11am

We need to have better publicity earlier in the season by working with VW and Riverplace as well as the city counsel. This year there was a lot of last minute catch up. Now we know what the event looks like. We need to have 3 to 4 people man the MVVC booth at specific hours to sell merch and such, I recommend we have food and drink for those workers.

Well that is what came to my mind. I am open to any other constructive ideas to make the show better. Moving it back to Ann Arbor/Ypsi is not an option unless you want to put on a 2nd show and head it up yourself which the club would support.

Thanks to all that showed up. I look forward to making the show better for next year and to do everything in my power to make the club stronger and more vibrant. The board works for the club. If you want to change the club, get on the board. Everything we do is done for the benefit of the club at large.
